- b. Walking Audit Update
 - i. Crosswalk Painting: The Below Northside Crosswalks were identified for repainting in the walking audit. Many of these routes are along student walking routes. This information was shared with Public Works and a request was made to have them repainted early spring. *Based on our walk audit discussions the bolder style was preferred if possible in repainting along the school routes since it is more visible.*

Requested Crosswalk Locations:

- 1. Maple St & E. North (outside school) this is where the painted bump outs were placed, can they be filled in with white as well to stand out.
- 2. Maple St & E. Broad (student walk)
- 3. Maple St & E. Union (student walk)
- 4. Linden St & E. North (student walk) this is where the painted bump outs were placed, can they be filled in with white as well to stand out.
- 5. Maple St & E. Goepp (MS, HS, Elem. route difficult intersection)
- 6. Main St. & W. Fairview (outside school)
- 7. N New Street & East Goepp
- 8. New & W. Fairview this is where the painted bump outs were placed, can they be filled in with white as well to stand out.
- 9. Linden & E. Maple (outside school)
- 10. Linden & Broad received upgraded signals in 2023. In anticipation of the Food Co-Op Opening and the high number of students that walk here can we have this repainted as well.

Suggestions for future Traffic Light upgrades:

Feedback from our Northside Alive Walking Audit called out the following two intersections lacked some pedestrian friendly infrastructure and would be good candidates for potential upgrades.

1. Main Street & West Goepp

- Older Traffic Light, No Push Button or Visual Walk/Countdown
- Crossing Guard Present Before/After School
- Walking route for William Penn Students and route to Main Street from Moravian

2. <u>N New Street & East Goepp</u>

- Older Traffic Light, No Push Button or Visual Walk/Countdown
- Crossing Guard Present Before/After School

One will be placed in Elmwood Park and one at Johnston Park. New holiday pole wraps were purchased and will be installed on the broad street acorn post between New & Center Street for years to come.

There is a strong desire from the committee members to focus on beautification.

Items that came to the top of the list are as follows:

- A solution to the litter and lack of waste receptacles (including pet waste)
- Planters
- Seating & Tables
